The son of a wealthy of the planter-slaveholder George at age 11 lost his father and formed his personality was strongly influenced by the elder half-brother Lawrence. Having home education WA a lot of time devoted to self-education. Being a slave owner he did not approve of the institution of slavery but believed that freed slaves far in the future. After his brother's death in 1752, inherited the large estate of mount Vernon with 18 slaves and the rank of major and became commander of one of the four districts virgin of the militia. Washington participated in the activities of Ohio the company sought to seize land West of the Appalachian mountains in the Ohio river valley. In 1755 he participated in the unsuccessful expedition to virgin colonists to the French Fort, duken in Ohio. With the beginning of the Seven years war in 1756 George Washington with the rank of Colonel, he headed the detachments of the virgin the militia which were guarding the Western border of the colony. In 1759 he resigned and the same year married a wealthy widow Martha Dandridge Custis Martha Dandridge Custis 1731-1802. Washington George In the years 1758-1774, Washington was elected to the chamber of citizens Virginia at one time served as judge of the County of Fairfax. Washington criticized the actions of the colonial authorities promoted a boycott of British goods but disapprovingly perceived violent incidents like the Boston the tea party of 1773.
